Day One (evening) (6pm to 9:30pm with break):

IN CLASS

- Introductory comments and safety briefing
- Introduction to Training Staff and Learning Objectives for the Course
- Awareness level TLAER concepts
- Introduction – emergency & disaster preparedness for large animals (history)
- Basic concepts in large animal emergencies & disaster rescue
- The incident command system related to TLAER incidents including; roles of the Veterinarian, Owner, Emergency Responders & OSPCA on scene
- Q and A

Day Two: (time 8:30am to 4:00pm)

IN CLASS (am with break)

- Review (previous night's material) and safety briefing (PPE list for participants, Truck assignments, Appointment of ISO)
- Introduction to large animal behaviour and scenes (normal behaviour & stress behaviour)
- Equine anatomy
- Overview of containment & restraint large animals
- Trailer safety (what you could find in the trailer)

DEMONSTRATION AND HANDS ON (Group Rotations)

- Overview of basic & TLAER supplies & equipment
- Behaviour, approach, basic handling (emergency halters), restraint & leading animals (kick zones, blind zones)
- Awareness of simple manipulation methods (sideways drag, backwards drag, Hampshire Slip, cast horse rolls, etc.) (mannequins)
- Containment methods and equipment needed
- Awareness of confined space, Trench considerations in TLAER (sideways drag)
- Buggy harness (accidents with horse and buggy)

Day Three (8:30 to 4:30)

IN CLASS (with break)

- Overview of Hazmat issues in TLAER and emergency decontamination of animals
- Highlights of critical medical concerns during large animal incidents including zoonosis (veterinary perspective)
- Implementing proper emergency field humane euthanasia for large animals
- Large animal ambulances and considerations for responding to incidents involving large animals
- Introduction to water rescue (pools, flat & swift water), unstable ground & mud, ice surface rescue for TLAER scenarios
- In depth – What NOT to do in TLAER (review of live rescues) (case scenarios)

- Trench and mud rescues (drags and lift)
